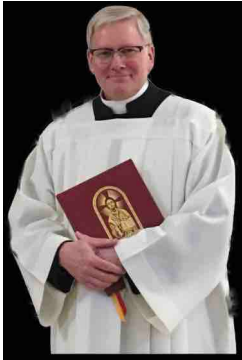

My sincere thank you to all the State Officers, Directors, Committee members and Council Officers and members in general across the State of

Wisconsin that have supported the initiatives that were part of my objectives as your State Deputy. A special thank you to all our Ladies that supported us and made allowances at home while we were away handling our assigned duties.

I believe from the positive responses I received, our 125th Annual convention was well received. The State Technology Team worked very hard to have a new website available for your review which will greatly enhance the level of support and information you all need to handle your daily operations and timely & up to date communications regarding programs and future events overall. Your response to the website preview was overwhelming.

As we enter the final month of this fraternal year, through your continued efforts, we are very, very close to having Wisconsin achieve the ultimate Circle of Honor recognition from Supreme.

**Here is where I need your council's help now, and I ask that you take this request seriously:** Although we are setting new records in growth with 1,107 new members already added as of May 22nd. and only need 36 more before June 30th. Wisconsin cannot achieve Circle of Honor without also having a minimum of 51 Star Councils.

Attaining Star Council Status is your council's ultimate goal. This status means your council is continuing to be active in your communities and in your parish and your council is growing your membership so as to maintain your good works for many years to come.

To date, 13 of the 51 councils needed have already achieve their Star Council Status. Great work men! 34 others of the 51 needed are already at or over 100% and just need to finalize the pending Fraternal Benefit events to qualify as a Star Council. Once those 34 finish their Fraternal Benefit Event requirements we will only need a minimum of four more councils to reach our goal of a minimum of 51 Star Councils. There are many councils that are very close to achieving 100% and already completed all the other programs.

**Depending on where your councils stand to date, can I get your commitment to get your Fraternal Benefit Events and 100% intake completed by June 15th?**

I would be grateful to all of you "God willing" to end my term as your State Deputy showing Supreme and the other 73 Jurisdictions that the Wisconsin Jurisdiction Knights of Columbus membership has demonstrated what it takes to go above and beyond by receiving the Prestigious Circle of Honor award on your behalf at the Supreme Convention in Denver Colorado in August 2026.

I also look forward to serving next year as the Immediate Past State Deputy. I offer my congratulations and hereby commit my full support to the new slate of State Officers and the membership in general as we move forward into another exciting year.

Thank you all for the opportunity to serve all of you these past two years.

**MAY WAS A SLOWER MONTH** for e-membership with only 53 new e-members. Councils transferred 57 e-members into Councils this month. I also know that we all had a lot going on in May with Mother's Day, State Convention, and Memorial Day.

As we near the end of the Fraternal Year, it is important that Councils review their Prospect List (e-members) and Candidate Lists and bring in as many new members as possible. Many Councils are 1 or 2 members away from earning the McGivney Award, and bringing in these Prospects and Candidates might be the new brothers that they need. While in person exemplifications are preferred, if schedules are not working out, please use the On-Demand Online Exemplification to get these brothers into your Councils and then invite them to get involved.

## REMINDERS

WGK & WFS please frequently review your councils **Prospect** tab. Should you experience any difficulty with this process, please email me regarding these outstanding assigned e-members and I will gladly assist you.

Do not send Form 100's to Supreme for new members. Keep them for your council's records. If you must use a Form 100, scan it, email it to Supreme, and keep the original for your council records. Since Form 100's must be manually processed at Supreme, they can lead to data entry errors and delays. Utilizing e-membership or the **Candidate** tab for new members are the preferred ways to bring in new members. **The date field is the date they were exemplified by your council. Once you enter those dates in either tab, the members will be automatically transferred to your council's roster within the next week.**

## PROSPECT TAB

Shows you e-members that have joined online via the Supreme app. The date field is used to transfer them into your council when they have completed their exemplification. With e-membership, new members enter their own data and confirm their membership, and then they receive an e-mail from Supreme. These e-members are then part of the state council, and get assigned to a local council. Until the local FS enters the exemplification date, these members remain part of the State Council. Local councils get credit for them when the exemplification date is entered by the FS to transfer them into your Council.

## CANDIDATE TAB

Used when you recruit a member locally or are handling a member transfer request or a reinstatement of a prior member. The Candidate tab can best be described as an online Form 100. The candidate tab training covers new members and transfers into local councils.

With the school year wrapping for me, this verse is especially powerful. We run the race of life every day. But we need to

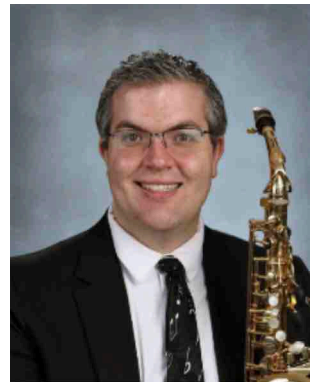
stop and ask ourselves how the race is going. Are we running mindlessly or are we running with a focus?

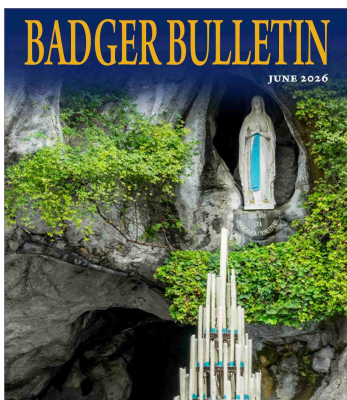
